#### Snapshot of Isaiah

**The Man:** Occupation: He served in the royal court as historiographer before being called by the Lord to be a prophet. He recorded the acts of both King Uzziah (2 Chr 26:22) and King Hezekiah (2 Chr 32:32).

**Ministry:** After the Lord's call, Isaiah served 60 years during the reigns of Kings Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah in the Southern Kingdom of Judah.

**The Book:** The book of Isaiah was written mainly to encourage the Southern kingdom of Judah to remain faithful, or they would suffer the same fate of their sister kingdom (Israel) who were captured by the Assyrians. In order to help Judah understand the importance of their kingdom, there are many prophecies concerning the Messiah written in this book. These prophecies were fulfilled in the life of Jesus.

#### Structure of Isaiah:

- I. Threats of Judgment
  - A. Chapters 1-35 (Assyrian invasion anticipated)
    - 1. Mingled rebukes and promises (Ch. 1-6)
    - 2. The Book of Immanuel (Ch. 7-12)
    - 3. Burdens (Ch. 13-23)
    - 4. General Judgment (Ch. 24-27)
    - 5. Woes (Ch. 28-33)
    - 6. General Judgment (Ch. 34-35)
  - B. King Ahaz
    - 1. Was told not to worry about the Assyrians
    - 2. Refused to rely on the Lord and sought political solution instead
- II. Historical Connecting Link

A. Chapters 36-39 (The Book of Hezekiah)

- 1. Assyrian attack
- 2. Babylonian invasion anticipated
- B. King Hezekiah (Son of King Ahaz)
  - 1. Refused to associate with the Assyrians
  - 2. Later in life, sought alliance with Babylon
  - 3. Babylonian invasion begins
- III. Promises of Deliverance

A. Chapters 40-66 (Babylonian Conquest Assumed)

- 1. Book of Cyrus (Ch. 40-48)




