[TO THE CHOIRMASTER. OF THE SONS OF KORAH. ACCORDING TO ALAMOTH. A SONG.]

- [1] God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

"[6] I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. [7] So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth." (1 Cor 3:6-7)

I love to work in the yard. There is just something about being outside working with plants and watching them grow that relaxes me. Well, as long as the plants grow the way they should, I am relaxed. But there are times when I don't get the results I am looking for, and that is when I have to remember that there may be times when plants grow without showing signs of growth.

Before I met Michael in 2006, I had an idea for the flower bed at my home in New Smyrna Beach, Florida. I took a 10 pound bag of sunflower seeds that were for feeding birds and planted them. My theory was that since other seeds around the bird feeder sprouted when left on the ground, the seeds I planted should produce sunflowers. A week after planting the seeds, I took a trip to visit my family in Atlanta, and when I went back home a few days later, there were many sprouts that grew into a very dense bed of sunflowers. My theory was a success!

4 months after marrying Michael in 2007, we moved to Port Orange, Florida. At our new home, I wanted to plant sunflowers again, so I did the same thing with the 10 pound bag of seeds. Unfortunately, the seeds were taking longer to sprout, so I was getting frustrated at my "failure" to grow sunflowers. After 3 weeks had passed, we were taking a trip to Atlanta to visit family, and I made up my mind that after we returned home, I would find something else to plant. When we returned home, I was happy to see our sunflowers sprouting, and a few weeks later, we had just as many sunflowers as I did the first time I planted seeds. I just had to be patient and give the seeds time to sprout, but since I was basing my success on what happened the first time, I was frustrated and ready to quit before seeing the results.

When we plan events at church, there is a temptation to declare what success would look like. There are some events that will produce results while others will look like a waste of time. No matter what happens with events, we have to keep in mind that we are planting seeds, and even though the seeds may have sprouted quickly before, they may take more time to grow this time. One of the laws of the harvest is that we sow in one season and reap in another. That means that immediate results are not always seen when seeds are planted. We should not be discouraged when we do not reap results in the same season we have sown. Remember that one man plants, another man waters, but God is the one who makes it grow.

In contrast, our beautiful Savior welcomes us into His presence-always! Jesus doesn't hole up inside a secure compound or wall Himself off behind impenetrable security. No, He enfolds us in His grace, inviting us to come close and to stay close, forever!

As Jesus lived here on earth, He made Himself accessible to all who came to hear the message of God's unending love for them. He healed the sick. He touched the lepers. His inexhaustible mercy made Him beautiful beyond words in their eyes.

Still today, Jesus is present with us, accessible at any and every moment. We can call out to Him with any need, any concern. He gladly invites us to spend time with Him, to share our lives with Him. He longs for us to stay near, to nestle close to His heart, secure in His love.

What's more, the more time we spend with Him, thinking about His acceptance, pouring over the promises in His Word, reflecting on His compassion, the more like Him we become. We are transformed-changed-into His very image, with ever-increasing glory.
