## "And he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was submissive to them. And his mother treasured up all these things in her heart." (Luke 2:51)

The last reference to Jesus as a child gives the place where He lived, Nazareth. Later in the Gospels, there are additional references to Jesus living in Nazareth, so it can be determined with certainty that Nazareth was His hometown.

Located near the Sea of Galilee, Nazareth is situated in a basin in the south side of a hill. A ten minute climb to the top of that hill is the best view in the whole area of Galilee. Looking to the north, there are fertile hills and valleys, and in the distance, the snow capped Hermon can be seen. There are many prosperous cities in the midst of the fertile hills and valleys, one of which could be Sepphoris. Three miles from Nazareth was the ancient home of Jonah, Gath-hepher. To the south, the Plain of Esdraelon extends from the Jordan River to the Mediterranean Sea. Ten miles west of Nazareth is Mount Carmel in full view, where Elijah had the contest with the prophets of Baal. Southwest from Nazareth, about the same distance as Mount Carmel, is the famous battlefield of the nations, known as Armageddon. There are many other sites located eight miles south of Nazareth: Shunem was where Elisha raised the Shunammite's son from the dead, and Gideon battled against the Midianites near the spring of Harod. Jezreel, Mount Gilboa, Endor, and the Kishon River were also significant during the Old Testament period. All of these places were visible from the top of the hill that is located beside Nazareth.

Nazareth is in a location that is rich with Biblical history, but the town itself is not known for anything as Nathanael mentioned in the Gospel of John, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:46) During the silent years of Jesus, this town was very small compared to Sepphoris, which was three miles away. With three hundred people living in Nazareth, there is a chance that the majority of the people came from one family. Considering the small size of Nazareth, it is hard to imagine that there were many opportunities for work within the city limits. Expounding upon the statement made by Nathanael in the Gospel of John, the possibility of anything significant coming out of Nazareth was as likely as the small town of Mountain City, GA becoming known as an international city. This being the case, it is very likely that the men of Nazareth had to seek work in neighboring cities, and with Sepphoris nearby, it is possible that the men would commute to Sepphoris so they could provide for their families.

Around 4 BC, the city of Sepphoris was destroyed by the Roman Empire because of a regional revolt. When Antipas gained control of Galilee, he received imperial permission to rebuild Sepphoris so he could use that city as an administrative capital and a model city of Greco-Roman culture in Galilee. Because of this status, several significant structures were being rebuilt, and a theatre was also created to support the fine arts. In contrast to Sepphoris, the small town of Nazareth was nothing more than a farming community. No significant structures have been found, and there is no mention of Nazareth in the Old Testament. Nazareth could have been settled by the Maccabees when they were relocated during the inter-testamental period. Just like other cities around Sepphoris, Nazareth supplied the food for the capital city, so the main industry was farming. Keeping this in mind, a carpenter would have to travel outside of Nazareth to find work of any significance. If this was the case, it is logical to believe that part of the reason why Jesus waited so long to begin His public ministry is because He could have wanted to finish the theatre project in Sepphoris before leaving Nazareth.

It's easy, too, to pray it for the beautiful sisters in Christ who mourn with us at the loss of a loved one. Or for the sister who encourages us as we fight against an ugly addiction.


But then there are those other sisters...

Pray for these sisters? That's a lot harder! Still, it's the call the words of Psalm 90:17 place on our lives. What makes it so hard to ask God to place His beauty upon them? Why do we hesitate? In a word-an ugly word-envy. Envy hisses, "She doesn't need your prayers. She already has it all. She isn't praying for you! She's only out to use you!"

Don't listen to this temptation! Instead, repent of it! Ask God to forgive you and to remind you of the beauty you have received from Him in the cross of His Son. Then, from a beautiful heart speak beautiful words of intercession for your sisters in Christ.
